GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

Welcome Brothers, family and friends to the next quarterly edition of the St. George Knights of Columbus Council Newsletter. We have left one crisis, the pandemic, and entered another, the Russian invasion of Ukraine. Since February 24, 2022 millions of Ukrainians have fled their country. The KofC and friends have donated over \$9 million dollars to support humanitarian aid in Ukraine. Please pray for the people of Ukraine and for a quick end to this war.

The Knights at St. George sold State Charity tickets after masses on January 15-16, 22-23 and 29-30. Due to the generosity of our parishioners and all the Knights who volunteered to sell the tickets and make it a success. Tickets are still on sale until May at the Church Office and at the Council Meetings. Half of the total ticket sales go to St George.

On February 18th we had the privilege of helping cook the spaghetti dinner and directing traffic in the parking lot for the Teen Life Group. The funds raised at the Spaghetti Drive Through Dinner will be used for their upcoming retreat.

A Membership drive was held on March 26th and 27th. Monsignor Pinti talked prior to all Masses about the Knights of Columbus. He also played a video by Bishop Weisenburger who talked about the Knight's impact on his life and the importance the Knights have on the Church. That gave us the opportunity to sell Charity Chips. We have sold 45 thus far with only 55 more to go. Chips can be purchased on our webpage, KofC7243.org.

There are events coming up over the next few months. First is Mother's Day May 8th, we will hand out prayer cards to the mothers and grandmothers after all Masses at St. George. On Father's Day June 19th, we will do the same thing for our fathers and grandfathers. Stay tuned for information for the KofC Breakfasts which will start in May or June. Once we have the dates, we will advertise them in the Church Bulletin. The breakfasts are a great way for the Knights to work and socialize, the more the merrier.

As always, if you have family, friends or know someone who would like to be a Knight, talk to them and invite them to join. Sometimes it is a matter of just asking.

FUND RAISING UPDATE

Council 7243 has a history of supporting both church and local programs, e.g., the Boys and Girls Clubs, St. George Student Scholarship Ministry, Families in Need programs, Seminarian and Postulate education assistance, Food Pantry, Pregnancy Centers, Ultrasound Machines, Community Outreach, ... The support takes many forms, from financial donations to sponsoring programs in the church and the community to providing volunteer labor. Our most recent fund raising endeavors involve sales of Charity Chips and KofC State Raffle tickets.

CHARITY CHIPS SALES

Charity Chips Round 1 sales were so well received we were able to begin drawings early (11/08/21.) We have held 6 monthly drawings thru 04/11/22. Due to the positive response, we have instituted token sales for Charity Chips Round 2, with in-person sales taking place after all masses on March 26th and 27th. The sales effort was very successful. 

If we don't have a Council, we can't have an Assembly." Thanks to Joe for volunteering. That being said, we remain open to another Brother Knight volunteering to be of service and become GK, a very worthwhile and rewarding experience. There are many Past Grand Knights in the council, including Immediate Past Grand Knight Campbell, willing to assist.
- ** Treasurer Zudycki would like to be replaced for personal reasons but is willing to remain as Treasurer if Trustee Wolf is willing to fill in for him when he is on vacation travel. Tom has graciously agreed to fill in as needed. That being said, as with the GK position, we remain open to another Brother Knight volunteering to be of service and become Treasurer.

Just as a reminder, the deputy grand knight fills in for the grand knight when he is not present, ultimately assisting the grand knight in leading the council and reaching council objectives. As part of the council's succession plan, the deputy grand knight usually becomes grand knight when the grand knight completes his term. The chancellor assists both the grand knight and deputy grand knight in leading the council by engaging and strengthening the council's members. His primary responsibilities include both recruiting and retaining members.

Serving as an officer can be a personally rewarding experience. Brother Knights, please pray for guidance and contact Tom to volunteer. Time is of the essence since the slate must be presented at the May 9th council meeting.
