ULTRASOUND PROJECT

This project falls under the auspices of the Supreme Council's Culture of Life Grant Program, which matches 100% of the donation. There have been 500 ultrasound machines procured under this program, with 17 in the state of Arizona.

The council officers voted unanimously to authorize \$1,000 for the state ultrasound program, part of which is returned to the council. Assembly 2943 opted to match the council's donation, for a total of \$2,000.
