There are many reasons that not all of our members have been able to join the Zoom meetings. One of the purposes of this newsletter is to be able to communicate with all our members and maybe future members. There are several topics in this newsletter focusing on the things we have been involved in, are involved in and are accomplishing. I believe even during this pandemic you will be surprised of all the things we have done. As always, we need your input to keep this council interesting and involved in good works. None of us are authors, so please let us know where we are lacking and hopefully where we have hit the mark. Let's keep looking forward.

## **FUND RAISING UPDATE**

Council 7243 has a history of supporting both church and local programs, e.g., the Boys and Girls Clubs, St George Student Scholarship Ministry, Families in Need programs, ...

This year has been a challenging year with the COVID 19 virus pandemic. It has affected the council directly, with our meetings going remote, hindering our interaction with church parishioners and our ability to raise funds, e.g. Car Show and breakfasts, to support these various programs and ministries. In order to continue our support for these valuable programs, we need to identify new sources of donations to maintain our program budgets.

Your leadership team has explored various fundraising programs that would minimize direct contact, require minimal manpower and produce similar to greater fundraising success in donations. The new fundraising events we have identified going forward are a charity auction managed through Your Charity Auction and the 100 Club, a 50/50 type Token Monthly drawing program. Each has the potential to raise in excess of \$5,000. We are still committed to supporting our traditional fund raising activities such as the Annual Car Show, proceeds from which go to the Boys and Girls Club and Parish Breakfasts.

100 Club. Once a year sale of 100 tokens at \$100. Approximately half of the money brought in would be used for the prize money. Each month a 1st and 2nd prize drawings are made of \$300. and \$100., for \$4800 total in annual prize money. The remainder, or \$5200, is kept by the Knights for charity. This is a ~50% profit margin. Our goal is to have all the tokens sold by year end, with monthly awards commencing in January.

Your Charity Auction (YCA). This is an on-line fundraising, silent auction, with a wide selection of products and K of C opportunity to obtain higher value products. Completed entirely on-line with a profit margin  $\sim$ 15-85%. Go to https://yourcharityauction.com for more information. Additionally, we have confirmed a volunteer familiar with YCA, who is available to manage the program. Our goal is to have the auction begin October 4<sup>th</sup>, and run for 4 or 5 days.

We remain committed to supporting our traditional fund raising activities such as the Annual Car Show, proceeds from which go to the Boys and Girls Club and Parish Breakfasts.


