Hope Women's Center in Apache Junction is a no-abortion women's center that supports KofC ideals. Last year we approved a \$250 donation to the organization. This year a motion was made and seconded to donate \$2,000 to the organization. The motion passed unanimously. KofC Supreme, through its Culture of Life Grant Program will donate \$100 for every \$500 the council donates, bringing the total donation up to \$2,400.

By way of background, Hope Women's Center was founded in 1984 as a small crisis pregnancy center in Apache Junction. Today, Hope is a safe place for women and teen girls facing any difficult life situation. Hope Women's Center is a faith-based nonprofit funded by partnerships with individuals, churches, civic groups, businesses, grants and foundations, and other community partners.

JUNE 18th SUNDAY BREAKFAST


Brothers:

MEMORIAL DAY PROJECT




